## ARTICLE III MEMBERSHIP IN THE SENATE

### Section 1. Distribution

Each department in the College of Arts and Letters, the College of Science, the College of Engineering, and the Mendoza College of Business shall have one Senate seat. The School of Architecture and the Law School each shall have one Senate seat. The College of Science shall have two additional seats, and the College of Arts and Letters, the Mendoza College of Business and the College of Engineering each shall have one additional seat. In addition, the programs of military science shall have one Senate seat, with that senator representing all of those programs. The emeritus faculty shall have two Senate seats; the special professional faculty shall have three Senate seats; the library faculty shall have two Senate seats; and the research faculty shall have one Senate seat.

*Correlative change in the Academic Articles:*

### Article IV, Section 3

#### ***Subsection (b) The Faculty Senate***

Each department in the College of Arts and Letters, the College of Science, the College of Engineering, and the Mendoza College of Business has one senate seat. The School of Architecture and the Law School each has one senate seat. The College of Science has two additional seats. The College of Arts and Letters, the Mendoza College of Business and the College of Engineering each have one additional seat. These senators are elected from the teaching and research faculty in the departments, Colleges, and Schools. The programs of military science collectively have one seat, with that single senator representing all three of those programs. The remaining seats are distributed on an at-large basis as follows: the emeritus faculty has two seats; the special professional faculty has three seats; the library faculty has two seats; and the research faculty has one seat. Senators are elected by majority vote for staggered three-year terms.
